**Botany:** Our third botany weekend early in February was attended by more than 40 budding botanists with a talk by Buffelskloof resident botanist and author John Burrows and a ramble up Robins Kloof which yielded our very special *Gladiolus Cateactarum*. A sample was carefully brought to artist Gill Condy who delighted us all with her demonstration of botanical illustration. Many thanks to botanists Frans Krige and Kevin Gill who shared their fountains of knowledge on the flora of Verlorenkloof.

Also in February, we were visited by friend and well known botanist Elsa Pooley, who brought a group of French orchid hunters to explore our kloofs. I am delighted to report that, with their and Frans Krige's able assistance, our orchid list was upped from 19 to 26 species.
